Restore Omaha Conference a Great Learning Experience

The second annual **Restore Omaha Conference**, **Exhibition. and Tour** (November 3-5) attracted nearly 900 people who love older properties. The event started off Friday night with a great opening reception at Joslyn Castle, complete with tours of the castle. On Saturday, attendees heard from keynote speaker **Bob Yapp**, and about 20 breakout session speakers about how to preserve and restore their homes or businesses. On the exhibition floor were 50 representatives of products, craftsmen, and associations geared toward restoring, repairing, and preserving older buildings. Sunday morning there were hands-on workshops at Metro Community College that included window repair, plaster repair, woodturning, and electrical basics. Nearly 400 people also attended a tour of midtown homes, churches and businesses on Sunday which included Bemis Park, Joslyn Castle and our own Gifford Park neighborhoods. Special thanks to Steve & Rose Carlson, Paul Farrand & Julie Kalkowski, and Terry & Sue Wilwerding for having their wonderful Gifford Park homes on display for the tour. It was a great day for our neighborhood, including perfect fall weather, to show what great homes and people we have. In fact, some people were asking if there were any homes for sale in our neighborhood how's that for a positive statement!

Attendee response for the second annual event was enthusiastic. Everyone agreed the value of the conference was far and above the small cost of just \$20 and \$5 for the Midtown home tour. Money raised from this year will provide seed money for next year's event. *continued on page 3*

From The President . . .

Another great year in the neighborhood passes. I hope December finds everyone warm, happy, and settling into early sunsets, as nature suggests. To everyone who is still interested in a street tree (we know who you are), the GPNA's offer is still good into spring 07! We will contact you over the winter to pick out your tree and set up a planting date with the nursery in early spring.

If you've traveled around midtown lately you can see that Mutual of Omaha knocked down the first building along Dodge Street (east of 33rd). According to MNA chair **Jim Farho**, "eight more [buildings] to go." House of Lee and Kentucky Fried Chicken will close at the end of the year to allow demolition to proceed. 2009 is the anticipated opening year for development.

Midtown Neighborhood Alliance (MNA) welcomes two new neighborhoods into the 2007 alliance, Dundee Memorial Park and Bemis Park Neighborhood Association. The alliance is looking forward to three planned projects for the coming year. The first is the annual fireworks show/fundraiser at the Field Club of Omaha. The second project is growing association memberships and the third project is a pocket walking guide to a historic midtown neighborhood. In 2007, two executive board positions are up for general election: president and secretary. The term is for two years; interested candidates can contact Jim Farho at <u>jfarho@cox.net</u>. MNA looks forward to another planning session in early 2007 to prioritize efforts.

Efforts are being made locally to address prostitution in midtown and throughout the state. **Gov. Heineman** vetoed the funding but not the law change, on last year's

Gifford Park Cats: How You Can Help

Working with **Feline Friendz** and the **Nebraska Humane Society**, several GPNA members are launching **''Gifford Park Cats''**, a neighborhood-wide **Trap-Neuter-Release (T-N-R)** program to address our stray and feral cat concerns. Cats are humanely trapped, spayed/neutered, vaccinated, and returned to their territory to live in managed colonies. T-N-R has been effective around the world, as it humanely controls feral cat populations and prevents litters of homeless kittens, resulting in stable, healthy feral populations and a reduced number of cats annually destroyed in our shelters.

Gifford Park Cats can be effective only with YOUR help. Therefore, the taskforce (**Michelle Rubek** - director, **Diane Inserra**, & **Clarinda Karpov**) asks you to please telephone **553-3736** if you:

- 1) know of feral/stray cats in the neighborhood; how many and where
- 2) are currently feeding homeless cats; how many, where, adult or kitten, gender if known, and whether any are pregnant
- 3) would like to foster or adopt home-able cats and kittens
- 4) can make a donation, no matter how large or small
- 5) have questions about T-N-R or Gifford Park Cats

The Nebraska Humane Society is working with the Omaha City Council to legalize the feeding of managed feral cat colonies. Pending this revision (expected by early January), the Humane Society has helped Feline Friendz to establish feral colonies all over the city.
