Free Tax Help Available At Yates School

The site for the annual free tax assistance is **Yates School, 32nd & Davenport St.** Tax help is available every **Wednesday** through **April 7,** from **1 to 3:30 p.m.**. Everyone is welcome! AARP representatives will provide free tax help for our neighborhood for the 16th year in a row. Processing of basic tax returns and electronic filing will be available. No appointment is necessary; individuals will be helped on a first come, first serve basis. Please call **Jackie** at **551-3629** for more information. To be able to provide assistance, persons will need to bring the following:

- 1. Valid Picture I.D.
- 2. Copy of prior year's tax return, if available
- 3. Unemployment compensation statements

4. Copies of ALL W-2, 1098, 1099 Forms and the amount of other income received by you and your spouse

5. Tax Identification Number (example: Social Security Number, Individual Tax Identification Number) for you, your spouse and any others shown on the tax return

6. All forms indication federal income tax paid 7. Dependent care provider information (name, employer, ID, Social Security Number)

8. All receipts or canceled checks if itemizing deductions

9. Form 8332 or copy of divorce decree for noncustodial parent claiming child

10. Proof of Account Number and Routing Transit Number of the financial institution for direct deposit into a savings or checking account

Midtown Neighborhood Alliance 2009 In Review

In 2009, MNA engaged the following events and initiatives:

- *Midtown Sparkles* annual fireworks show at Field Club, which raised over \$2700 for the organization

- *Celebrate Midtown* event at Joslyn Castle, which raised \$5000 for the organization

- Re-tree Midtown Initiative, which successfully secured over \$14,000 in grants and planted over 60 trees in five member neighborhoods

- Created a six-month crime prevention task force composed of all players in the city with a vested interest in this topic, for the purpose of education and awareness

- Expanded MNA boundaries to include two new neighborhood associations

- Promoted MNA at the Restore Omaha Conference

This year, a new logo was created, along with a squirrel mascot, for the purpose of branding MNA for public awareness.

In August, an offsite brainstorming meeting was held to determine direction and goals for 2010. As a result of feedback from that session, it was determined that MNA would pursue educational initiatives related to the following topics: Historic Preservation, Crime Prevention, Code Enforcement, and Green Initiatives. Committes were formed and chairpersons identified. These workshops will be offered throughout 2010.

Members of MNA continued to participate and play active roles in community meetings that addressed issues of interest to midtown, such as the Veteran's Administration building project and Business and Community Development in Gifford Park. The organization also sent letters advocating issues that impacted our member neighborhood associations.

MNA also continued its partnership with Destination Midtown on a variety of initiatives, including the Spirit of Midtown Award Committee.

Neighborhood Associations belonging to the MNA include Aksarben-Elmwood Park, Bemis Park, Blackstone, Columbus Park, Dundee Memorial Park, Elmwood Park, Field Club, Ford Birthsite, Gifford Park, Hanscom Park, Leavenworth, Morton Meadows, North Gold Coast, and Park East.

Important Traffic Note

The on-ramp from Cuming St. to south-bound traffic on Hi-Way 75 and I-480 will close on **March 15** and remain closed until sometime later in June 2010. Traffic will still be able to access I-480 east bound from Cuming St. The closing is needed to place concrete paving on the new on-ramp.

Restore Omaha 2010 Draws Older Property Enthusiasts

We estimated that over 250 people attended this year's 5th annual **Restore Omaha Conference** held March 5-6 at Metro Community College South Omaha Campus. The opening reception started Friday night at Frank's Pieces of the Past (814 South 14th St – Frank Horejsi, an architectural salvager since the 1980's displayed his amazing collection of old artifacts from some of the area's most memorable historic buildings). Attendees then had food & drinks at Lucile's in the Old Market (near 10th & Howard).

Saturday's conference included Tim Reeder's presentation "From Rags to Riches – The Restoration of a Grand Victorian". Most in the audience could relate to both the hard work and satisfaction of restoring an old house. Tim even showed a picture of a horse and carriage in front of his house taking folks to the Trans-Mississippi Exposition held in Omaha in 1898. **Donovan Rypkema**, a nationally renowned economist, was the keynote speaker. He spoke on commercial revitalization and how it spurs redevelopment in surrounding neighborhoods, and he presented ways to build a sustainable future through historic preservation. Saturday night after the conference, a few of us were lucky enough to have dinner with Donovan; we took the opportunity to absorb more of his great expertise and philosophy on the importance of saving and maintaining our neighborhood's older buildings and homes. We had excellent breakout sessions to teach people how to fix up their older properties - these included stained glass restoration, hiring a contractor, stucco & plaster repair, window repair, Victorian gardens, Omaha's historic apartment buildings, Omaha's electrical code, and more. The day concluded with the Restoration Jam! where attendees shared pictures and experiences of their home projects and solutions. Many thanks to the volunteers who worked on the conference. And special thanks to GPNA volunteers (**Cynthia Shuck, John Barna, Luther & Deb Larson, Paul Mileris, Martin Janousek**, and **Chris & Sallie Foster**) who worked our GPNA booth to promote the good things in our neighborhood and community garden.
