RESTORE OMAHA CONFERENCE WILL INVIGORATE OWNERS OF OLDER PROPERTIES

The fifth annual **Restore Omaha Conference** is scheduled for **Friday and Saturday, March 5 and 6, 2010**. The Conference provides a wide-range of learning opportunities to promote the practice of historic restoration to the public and professionals. Focus of the conference is mid-twentieth century and older homes and business properties.

There are several exciting experiences planned for this year's conference. On Friday, March 5, the Conference opening reception will be held at **Frank's Pieces of the Past** at **814 S. 14th St**. Owner Frank Horejs has been an architectural salvager since the 1980's and has a remarkable warehouse of historic salvage that represents Omaha's past. Plan to swap experiences with conference speakers and participants.

On Saturday, March 6, conference keynote and learning sessions are scheduled from 9:00 am – 4:00 pm at Metropolitan Community College, South Omaha Campus, Industrial Training Center. Concurrent sessions are scheduled on a variety of topics: Stained Glass Restoration; Restoration of a Commercial Building; Historic Gardening; Window Reglazing and Wood Consolidation; Selecting, Bidding and Hiring a Contractor; History of Omaha's Historic Apartments; The Economic Power of Restoration; Omaha's Electrical Codes and many more.

This year's conference also features keynoter, **Donovan Rypkema**, principal of PlaceEconomics, a Washington, D.C.-based real estate and economic development-consulting firm. Rypkema specializes in commercial revitalization and its effects on the surrounding neighborhoods. The City of Omaha, Destination Midtown, and the South Omaha Development Project all have neighborhood commercial district revitalization on their near-term agendas.

Vendors who specialize in restoration and preservation will also be available.

Inaugural Social Impact Forum Omaha Promises To Engage, Empower, & Energize

The first annual *Social Impact Forum Omaha* will be held on **Friday, Feb. 26**, at **Creighton University's Harper Center**. This action-oriented conference will engage, empower and energize hundreds of local leaders and change makers to address the increasingly complex and connected challenges facing our community. "Our world can seem complicated and the deeper meaning in everyday life appears to be elusive for many. Social Impact Forum Omaha (SIFO) is geared towards those people who choose to see the world as an opportunity to make the world a better place in multiple different avenues and from many different angles," said **Taylor Keen**, a forum co-chair and instructor in the Social Entrepreneurship Program at Creighton University's College of Business.

The theme of the inaugural conference is "Challenge Yourself. Change Your World." A series of breakout sessions and keynote speakers will:

- Educate attendees about social enterprise and how entrepreneurial principles can affect social change,
- Provide best practices, innovative strategies, tools and information to support current social entrepreneurs,
- Inspire new social entrepreneurs and programs/projects,
- Bring people together to network, find partnership opportunities and develop support systems.

The cost to attend the forum is \$50 or \$35 for nonprofit attendees and \$20 for students. Session topics include: Creating a Culture of Prosperity, Moving the Mind: How the Arts and Culture Change the Community, Thinking Globally, Eating Locally: Effecting Change One Bite at A Time, and Empowering Youth Organizations Leading the Charge. The site for the annual free tax assistance is **Yates School**, 32nd & Davenport St. Tax help is available every **Wednesday**, **February 3** through **April 7**, from **1** to **3:30 p.m.**. Everyone is welcome! AARP representatives will provide free tax help for our neighborhood for the 16th year in a row. Processing of basic tax returns and electronic filing will be available. No appointment is necessary; individuals will be helped on a first come, first serve basis. Please call **Jackie** at **551-3629** for more information. To be able to provide assistance, persons will need to bring the following:

- 1. Valid Picture I.D.
- 2. Copy of prior year's tax return, if available
- 3. Unemployment compensation statements
- 4. Copies of ALL W-2, 1098, 1099 Forms and the amount of other income received by you and your spouse
- 5. Tax Identification Number (example: Social Security Number, Individual Tax Identification Number) for you, your spouse and any others shown on the tax return
- 6. All forms indication federal income tax paid
- 7. Dependent care provider information (name, employer, ID, Social Security Number)
- 8. All receipts or canceled checks if itemizing deductions
- 9. Form 8332 or copy of divorce decree for non-custodial parent claiming child
- 10. Proof of Account Number and Routing Transit Number of the financial institution for direct deposit into a savings or checking account

Growing Season Draws Near At Gifford Park Community Garden

On the midpoint of winter—February 2—Punxsutawney Phil saw his shadow, and if we rely upon a marmot to predict spring's weather, we can expect six more weeks of cold. I'm sure most Nebraskans, if asked, would have given a similar forecast, since more than three feet of the white stuff has fallen since last October and much of it lingers in the piles we've shoveled off our walks and driveways. Needless to say, we're all counting down the days until spring officially begins on Saturday, March 20. The gardeners among us while away what remains of winter by poring over the innumerable seed catalogs arriving daily in the mail and anticipating the last frost of the season, a date averaging somewhere between April 30th and May 10th for our hardiness zone.
