Grants

We could use a break from the heavy rain (and even small hail on May 28!) and cool weather... some warmer and drier weather is needed about now. Check out the community garden at 35th & Cass Street, including our new 10-week-old "adolescent" chicks located in their coop on the uppernorth part of the garden, bee hives behind the "garden house" (next to the community garden on the west), and other features and plantings. Work nights continue each Wednesday 6 to 8pm through the growing season. At this time we have three small 5' x 8' plots available. During these times water

We are a certified community arboretum and our neighborhood is full of beautiful tree-lined streets. Let's add more! Bring your kids! The Gifford Park Neighborhood Association is working with The Urban Bird and Nature Alliance and the City of Omaha Parks department to honor the Hubbard Community Forestry and the Arbor Day Foundation award by planting over 150 trees in our neighborhood on Saturday June 1 from 8:30am to noon. Meet in Gifford Park at 35th St. & Davenport St. This will be one of the easiest tree plantings you've ever done, and if you have never planted a tree, you'll see how easy it is. We're fortunate that Great Plains Nursery is providing the trees and they will pre-dig the holes and do the first watering. Amazing!

We'll plant a wide variety of fruit trees and shade trees likely including such stunners as quaking aspen, autumn blaze maples, swamp white oaks, and more. Gifford Park staff are very excited to move into our new building and begin unpacking the tremendous amount of boxes that we have, as well as inventorying and distributing our new supplies.

Staff were able to tour the building for the first time Friday, 5/24/19. Carpet and tile flooring is currently being installed. Sidewalks and landscaping will begin within the next two weeks. Staff should be able to move in and begin unpacking boxes August 1st.

Gifford Park is excited to welcome three Pre-K classrooms that will join us from Yates. We will be home to the following Early Childhood programs: Pre-K (N.I.C.E), Pre-K (Migrant), and Pre-K (ESL).

Gifford Park staff will be participating in an "onboarding/team building workshop" the last three days of July. Our staff is coming from many OPS schools to include: Skinner Magnet, Central High School, Crestridge Magnet, Yates, Franklin, Conestoga, South High School, Minne Lusa, Miller Park, Kellom, and King Elementary. Lots of great activities are planned that will help our staff get to know one another, learn more about the community in which we will work, and build a great culture and sense of family so we are ready to welcome all of our students and Gifford Park families during Safe Routes to School on August 12th, from 5:00-6:30 p.m.
